




Almond, David **SKELLIG**


Avi **CRISPIN: THE CROSS OF LEAD**

Falsely accused of theft and murder, an peasant boy in fourteenth-century England flees his village and meets a larger-than-life juggler who holds a dangerous secret.




Balliett, Blue **CHASING VERMEER ***

When unrelated and strange events start to happen and a precious Vermeer painting disappears, eleven-year-olds Petra and Calder combine their talents to solve an international art scandal.




Colfer, Eoin **ARTEMIS FOWL ***


D'Adamo, Francesco **IQBAL**

In the year 241, 12-year-old Lina trades jobs on Assignment Day to a Messenger to run to new places in her decaying but beloved city.




Farmer, Nancy **THE SEA OF TROLLS**

In a future where the Police enforce the law of a family only having two children, Luke has lived his twelve years in isolation and fear on his family's farm, until another "third" convinces him that the government is wrong.



Kerr, P.B. **THE AKHENATEN ADVENTURE ***

When 12-year-old twins Philippa and John discover that they are descended from a long line of djinn, their mother sends them away to their Uncle Nimrod, who takes them to Cairo where he starts to teach them about their powers.




Konigsburg, E.L. **THE VIEW FROM SATURDAY**

Four students develop a special bond and attract the attention of their teacher, a paraplegic, who chooses them to represent their sixth-grade class in the Academic Bowl competition




Lord, Cynthia **RULES**


Rawls, Wilson **WHERE THE RED FERN GROWS**

A young boy living in the Ozarks achieves his heart's desire when he becomes the owner of two redbone hounds and teaches them to be champion hunters.




Sage, Angie **MAGYK ***


Spinelli, Jerry
